## **Singleton Lake Seasonal Information and Guidelines**

<u>License of Occupation:</u> There is to be only one family registered per site (2 adults and up to 2 dependent children under 18). All others must pay the visitors' fee. License of Occupation form can be found on our website <a href="www.singletonlake.ca">www.singletonlake.ca</a> under the Downloads section. It can be filled out online, saved to your computer, and emailed to <a href="info@singletonlake.ca">info@singletonlake.ca</a>

Your seasonal site: Must be kept neat and tidy with regular grass trimming around your trailer and fire pit. If you are unable to do this, please make arrangements to make sure the grass trimming gets done. Camp staff can also be hired to do so for a fee. Any site that has not been taken care of regularly, the camp staff will bill you for it to be done.

\*\*\*All sites must be raked and trimmed, ready for the season, by <u>May long weekend</u>. If not, you will be charged accordingly for camp staff to do it.

Please ensure that all junk and extra materials around your trailer is cleaned up.

## Your site is not to be used as a dumping ground.

There is to be one camping trailer, one vehicle and one shed per site. Extra vehicles are to be parked in the visitor parking areas.

Alcohol: Please keep your alcohol at your campsite! Do not walk around the campground with open alcohol.

**Beach:** There is a nice sandy beach for your enjoyment.

\* <u>Swim at your own risk – unsupervised swimming.</u> No dogs on the beach. Please clean up your garbage and cigarette butts on beach and grass sitting area. Children must be accompanied by an adult when swimming. No rough or horseplay on the raft! Do not allow children to go under the raft, as it is very dangerous!! No swimming after dark.

<u>Campfires:</u> Keep fires in designated fire rings only. Do not move your fire pit without prior permission. Please keep fires at a minimal height. Check with the office as to where you may dump your ashes. Do not burn anything other than wood in your fire pit!!

<u>Construction</u>: All construction **must be approved** by management prior to the start of the project. **Decks only** allowed! New screen rooms and permanent porches are no longer permitted! All projects must be completed in a reasonable time frame. **Most projects are not to be worked on in July or August when people are taking their vacations.** 

**Carports & Shelters:** are not allowed.

<u>Campers Association:</u> A camper run group of volunteers, whose mandate is to plan various activities for the campground to enjoy during the summer. Your help and input is important for its success! \*Association meetings are for planning activities only! Any campground related concerns should be directed to the office!

<u>Docks:</u> Personal docks and boat slips on camp docks are available for rent. No mooring at camp docks without permission. Parents ensure that children under 12 are supervised and are wearing a life jacket on the docks!

<u>Dump Station:</u> Located by the beach. <u>Everyone must use a hose on the end of the blue boy, while dumping!!</u> Dump at the tire ring. Mobile pumping is also available. Pump outs will be done usually once a week. Please sign up at the store. <u>NO dumping after dark!</u>

Fireworks: are not allowed on the camp property at all.

Garbage and Recycling: located near camp entrance ... please keep the area neat and tidy! First 10 garbage stickers are free. Beyond that, they are \$2.00/bag. Garbage stickers are available to purchase at the office. NO FISH GUTS to be thrown into garbage bin!!

Do not burn your garbage or recycling in your fire pit!

<u>Golf Carts</u> Only people with full car license are allowed to drive the golf carts in the campground. Proof of **liability insurance** is also required. Speeds must be kept low and full respect for others must be displayed at all times.

<u>Pets:</u> Keep your pets on a leash at all times and make sure that the dog does not encroach on other campers sites. Clean up after your pet!! No dogs on the beach swimming area. Dogs may go swimming on the boat ramp. Please keep them quiet and respectful!!

<u>Picnic tables:</u> You supply your own picnic table, however some camp tables are still possibly available.

Quiet Time: 11:00pm to 8:00am! Please have respect for others and be quiet as voices and music carry. Children and teens must be at their campsite by dark. No wandering around after dark.

<u>Sale of a Trailer:</u> Notify management prior to selling the trailer. Selling fee to be paid upfront when the trailer goes up for sale. This fee is valid for one season only. Fee to be paid again the following year if the trailer is not sold. The site <u>does not</u> automatically accompany the trailer. Older trailers may be asked to be removed from the park or given one years grace for the new owner to upgrade the trailer. 'For Sale' signs must be small and discreet. Trailer selling specifics must be written and submitted to office.

<u>Tents:</u> You are allowed to set up a tent on your lot, as additional sleeping quarters, for temporary use only! No permanent tents on your site please!

<u>Visitors:</u> Please ensure that your **visitors have registered** and paid either at the office or their names texted to Pete's cell 613-340-5138. You are responsible for your visitors, so please make sure they abide by the rules of the campground.

All visitors' cars should be parked at the designated visitor parking areas. You must notify the office if you are expecting more than one carload of people.

**Washing:** Because we are on well water, you may wash your trailer in the spring and fall only. No car washing is permitted at the camp.

Washrooms: These are your washrooms, please help keep them clean! No smoking or pets in the washrooms! Parents are responsible for your children; therefore ensure they respect the use of the washrooms as well! Doors to washrooms are locked. A \$10 deposit is required to obtain a key.
